

# How to Download from Tableau

1. Click **Download** located at the bottom of the viz.

(All active filters are applied to exported data)



2. Select one of the following options:

<p><b><u>Download Options</u></b></p>	<p><b>Note:</b> If a data column or row in the viz has not been selected, the Crosstab and Data options will be greyed out. Select a column or row header in the viz to make these options available.</p>	
<p><b>Tableau Workbook</b></p>	<p>Downloads a workbook you can open with Tableau Desktop. Get the free Tableau Reader <a href="#">here</a>.  <b>Note:</b> This option is only available if the author of the workbook or administrator has granted you permission to <b>Download/Save</b> the workbook.</p>	
<p><b>PDF</b></p>	<p>Downloads a PDF of selected sheets.  <b>Note:</b> If you are downloading a dashboard to PDF format, the web page objects will not be included.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Select <b>This Dashboard</b> for a screenshot of the current viz.</li> <li>• <b>Sheets in Dashboard</b> will include all data in selected worksheets.</li> <li>• Selecting <b>Sheets in Workbook</b> will only download one screenful of each selected worksheet.</li> </ul> <p><b><i>To download all data in all available sheets, it is recommended to use the 'Sheets in Dashboard' option.</i></b></p>	
<p><b>Crosstab</b></p>	<p>Downloads the viz as a .csv file in Microsoft Excel.</p>	
<p><b>Data</b></p>	<p>Opens a new tab in your browser and displays the viz's data in summary and detail. You can then download the data as a comma-separated value (.csv) file.</p>	
<p><b>Image</b></p>	<p>Choose this option to display data as a table in a web page.</p>	

**Note:** Downloading extremely large amounts of data can affect server performance and may not complete successfully. If you encounter these issues, try exporting the data directly from the underlying data source.
