Introduction

Industry trends are prepared to aid in research, policy making, economic development and other activities that require a reasonable glimpse into the future. These projections serve as important indicators of the relative magnitude and probable direction of industry growth and decline. This publication accounts for a ten-year projection period, and the figures represent a likely relationship between industries, given that the following economic assumptions remain true:

- 1. The institutional framework of the United States and Alabama economies will not radically change.
- 2. Major events, such as widespread, long-lasting energy shortage or a war will not significantly alter the industrial structure of the economy or the rate of economic growth.
- 3. Current technological, scientific and social trends such as values placed on work, education, income and leisure will continue.

For projections purposes, data is presented in a total employment concept. This includes wage and salary employment, agricultural workers, self-employed, unpaid family workers of a family-owned business and those employed in private households as domestic workers. Government-owned hospitals, educational providers and post office data will appear in their respective industry groups rather than in the government sector. Certain precautions are taken to keep the identity of survey respondents confidential; therefore, some industry data may not appear in this publication. However, the data will appear in industry group totals and the total employment data in order to present an accurate picture of employment in the area.


Industry Projections Highlights

- By the year 2032, over 2.4 million workers are projected to be working in Alabama
- Total employment is expected to increase by approximately 6.21 percent, with an average annual growth rate of 0.60 percent, between the base year of 2022 through the projected year of 2032.
- Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (NAICS 11) and Utilities (NAICS 22) are the only industry sectors projected to decline by a total net of -50.
- The Goods Producing sector is expected to increase by approximately 28,790 jobs over the projection period – growing at 0.73 percent annually. Manufacturing (NAICS 31-33) is projected to contribute approximately 74% of Goods Producing's net growth at 21,260.
- The Services Providing sector is projected to grow 0.62 percent annually, creating over 111,000 jobs over the projected period. Leisure and Hospitality and Education and Health Services are projected to have the highest percentages of growth at 11.62 percent and 7.95 percent respectively.
- Region 4 is projected to have the highest net change during the projected period with 36,460 new jobs. Region 7 shows the highest percent change and growth rate at 8.18 percent and 0.79 percent, respectively.

Industry Employment Projections Methodology

Introduction

Industry Employment Projections estimate change over a period of time. Long term projections cover a ten-year time-period and are produced every two years. Short term projections cover a two-year time-period and are produced once a year. The projections are based on the past industry employment trends and the addition of current economic changes such as opening and closings of companies. The preliminary projections are created using projections software provided to all state Labor Market Information programs in the nation to insure consistent methodology. The software is a microcomputer-based software system developed and technically supported by the Utah Occupational Projections Service Center, Utah Department of Employment Security under contract with the United States Department of Labor. After the preliminary projections have been completed, the analyst incorporates economic changes to produce the final projections.

Basic terms for understanding the estimation process

<u>NAICS Codes.</u> The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is the standard used by Federal statistical agencies in classifying business establishments for the purpose of collecting, analyzing, and publishing statistical data related to the U.S. business economy. The NAICS industry codes define establishments based on the activities in which they are primarily engaged.

Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW). The primary economic product is the tabulation of employment and wages of establishments which report to the Unemployment Insurance (UI) programs of the United States. Employment covered by these UI programs represents about 97% of all wage and salary civilian employment in the country.

<u>Presumed Non-Covered (PNC).</u> Employees exempt from state UI tax laws and therefore not counted by the QCEW. Examples include members of religious orders, elected officials and legislators, self-employed, and railroad employees.

<u>Current Employment Statistics (CES)</u>. The Current Employment Statistics (CES) survey is based on a sample of 390,000 business establishments nationwide. The survey produces monthly estimates of total non-farm employment that includes PNC, hours, and earnings for the nation, states, and major metropolitan areas. Preliminary national estimates for a given reference month are typically published on the first Friday of the following month.

<u>Self-Employed Workers.</u> Persons who work for profit or fees in their own business, profession, trade, or farm. Only the unincorporated self-employed are included in the self-employed category in the class of

worker typology. Self-employed persons who respond that their businesses are incorporated are included among wage and salary workers, because technically, they are paid employees of a corporation.

<u>Unpaid family workers.</u> Workers who work without pay for 15 or more hours per week on a farm or in a business operated by a member of the household to whom they are related by birth or marriage.

<u>Farm employment.</u> Establishments engaged in growing crops, raising animals, and/or harvesting fish and other animals from a farm, ranch, or natural habitats. This term does not include logging.

<u>County Business Patterns (CBP).</u> An annual series that provides subnational economic data by industry. This series includes the number of establishments, employment during the week of March 12, first quarter payroll, and annual payroll collected by the U.S. Census Bureau.

<u>Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA).</u> The regional economic accounts report geographic distribution of U.S. economic activity and growth. The estimates of gross domestic product by state and local area personal income, in addition the accompanying detail, provide a consistent framework for analyzing and comparing individual state and local area economies.

Estimation Process

- 1. The state constructs a historical industry series for each industry located in the area using QCEW. Alabama estimates at the 4-digit NAICS code; data more detailed than 4-digit would have too many confidential industries. The reasoning for this is that at the more detailed level, an individual could determine the employment for individual companies. PNC from the county business patterns is used to fill in any missing employment in QCEW. Some examples are churches and insurance agents. Railroad employment is taken from the CES estimate since the railroad employment is provided by Bureau of Labor Statistics. Next self-employed and unpaid family workers are added to the total, which is calculated in Occupational Employment Projections software. The farm employment, derived from BEA, is added. The last year of the historical series is the base year of the projections process.
- 2. The base year is processed through the BLS projections software. Multiple statistical models are run for each industry for the target projected year.
- 3. The statistical models are reviewed by the analyst to determine the best model based on historic growth rates, knowledge of the economy, and comparison to other industries that are connected to that industry.
- 4. Any known openings or closings that occur after the base year are applied to the projections so that the projected employment is as accurate as possible.

Economic Assumptions

The following assumptions are made in order to produce the industry projections.

- The institutional framework of the U.S. economy will not change radically.
- The long-term employment trends will not change.
- No major events will occur that alter the industry structure of the economy.
- Population growth rates and age distribution will differ significantly from the projections used as a variable.

Using Industry Employment Projections Data

The industry employment projections are an excellent source of information to estimate job opportunities by industry. However, when using the projections data, the user should know that these are estimates. The estimates are based on the assumption that historic trends will continue. Events such as a recession or natural disasters can dramatically affect the historic trends and ultimately the employment levels. For more information on employment one should look at the Occupational Projections which applies staffing patterns to the industry projections to produce employment levels by occupation for the state and regions.
