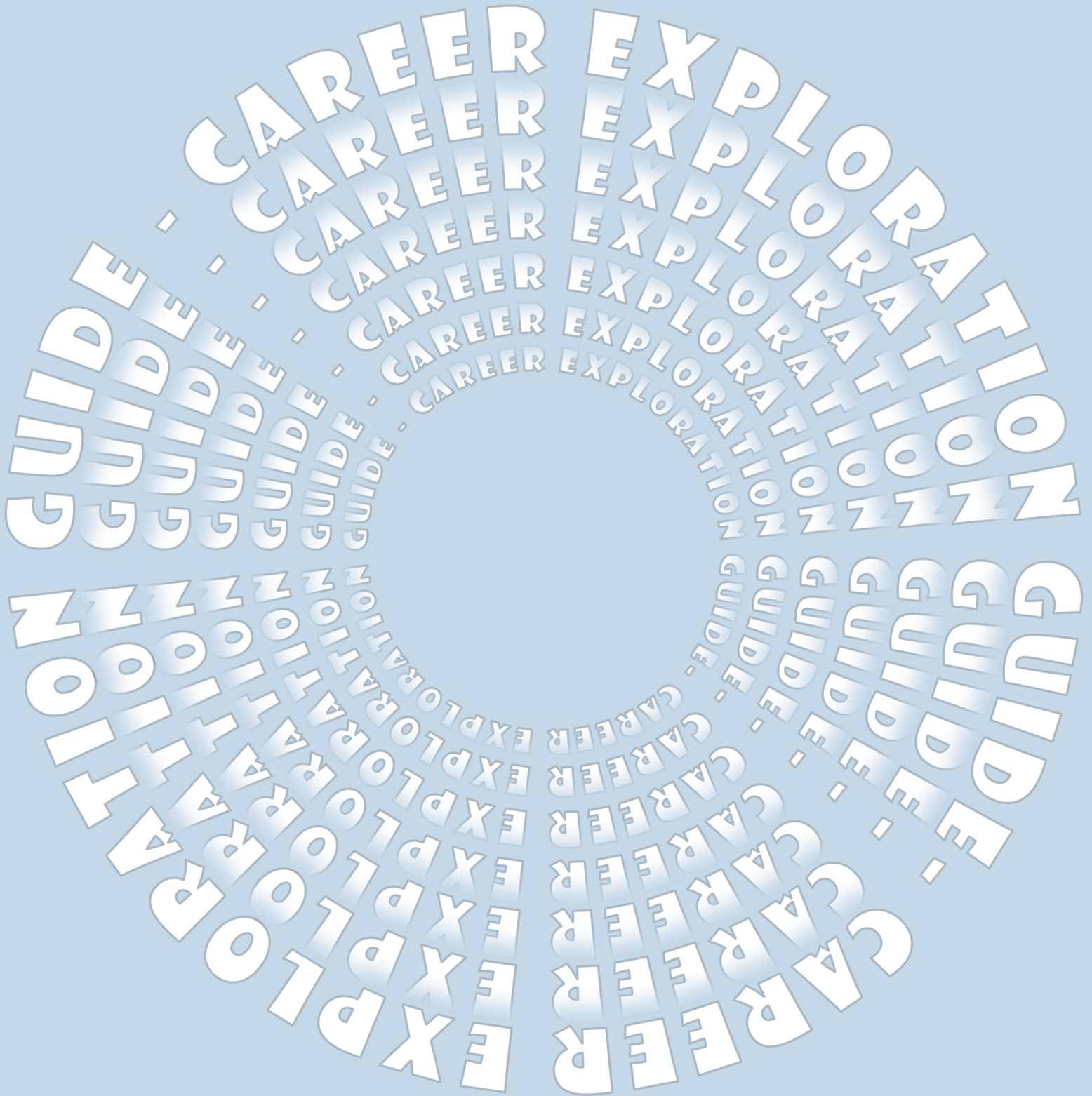

INTRODUCTION

Welcome to Alabama's ***Career Exploration Guide 2024 Edition*** produced by the Alabama Department of Labor, Labor Market Information Division. This product is designed as a guide to anyone seeking a job or considering a new career direction. Included in the publication is an array of information on **270** occupations. Topics listed for each occupation include education requirements, on the job training (OJT), job tasks, licensing information, and a job outlook for the occupation in the State of Alabama. Users are also provided an employment outlook for the state for each occupation. This gives readers an idea of how many people are employed in an occupation, what employment should look like in the next decade, how many openings are estimated in Alabama each year, and the entry, median and experienced wages one can expect to receive for a particular occupation. Another feature is a list of many of the postsecondary institutions in Alabama which offer training programs for specific occupations, as well as related occupations. We hope this feature will accelerate the process of finding training programs in the user's area. Choosing or changing careers requires a lot of planning and thought. This book should provide people with a great place to start.

Data Source

Information in the publication was compiled from several different sources. To allow our users to benefit from the wide range of information these resources offer, an explanation is provided below.

Occupational Information

Each occupation begins with a brief definition or description of the occupation. This information originates in the O*NET database. This database includes information on skills, abilities, work activities, and much more for over 950 occupations. O*NET uses an interactive skills-based database and everyday language to describe employee skills. O*NET offers its database online to allow everyone easy access to its valuable information. Job Zone

O*NET uses a Job Zone classification to categorize occupations into 5 different levels of job zones based on information from employees and occupational experts that are surveyed. This data is based on education level, experience, and training needed for workers to be successful in their jobs. Each level of job zone is attached with a preparation level: 1—Little or no preparation needed; 2—Some preparation needed; 3—Medium preparation needed; 4—Considerable preparation needed; and 5—Extensive preparation needed. Each of these job zones are given a narrative description for *On-the-Job-Training* (OJT) and for *Education* required. As a result, what you will read in these descriptions are based strictly on the job zones assigned in O*NET. Tasks

This section details a list of the most common tasks performed in in each occupation and is excerpted from the O*NET database.

Licensing Information

The licensing information is taken from the Licensed Occupations Guide, which is another publication distributed by the Alabama Department of Labor, Labor Market Information Division. Information regarding occupational descriptions, minimum qualifications, application procedures, fees, and agency contact information, was compiled from over 70 agencies, boards, or commissions. Job Outlook

Job outlook is set up into six categories that are based on average annual growth which is taken from Alabama's projected employment. This is described in more detail in the employment outlook section.

Excellent - above 3%

Very Good - between 2% and 3%

Good - between 1% and 2%

Satisfactory - less than 1%

No change

Poor - less than 0

Employment Outlook

All statewide data appearing in the Employment Outlook section is gathered and published by the Labor Market Information Division of the Alabama Department of Labor. Alabama's wage data is compiled through a biannual survey, which measures occupational employment and wage rates for wage and salary workers. The resulting data is published in the Alabama Wage Survey each year.

Alabama's projected employment data is estimated every two years for a 10-year period. The results are published in the Statewide Occupational Projections publication. The national occupational data is estimated by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. Postsecondary Institutions and ETPL Providers

Many of the occupations found in this publication require some degree of training after high school graduation. For occupations that call for additional training, this publication will provide a list of public-school training sites in the State of Alabama. The list provided is obtained from the ACHE (Alabama Commission on Higher Education) database and is current as of the publication date. The ETPL (Eligible Training Provider List) contains information on training providers in Alabama. Due to space constraints, this list is a partial excerpt from the database. 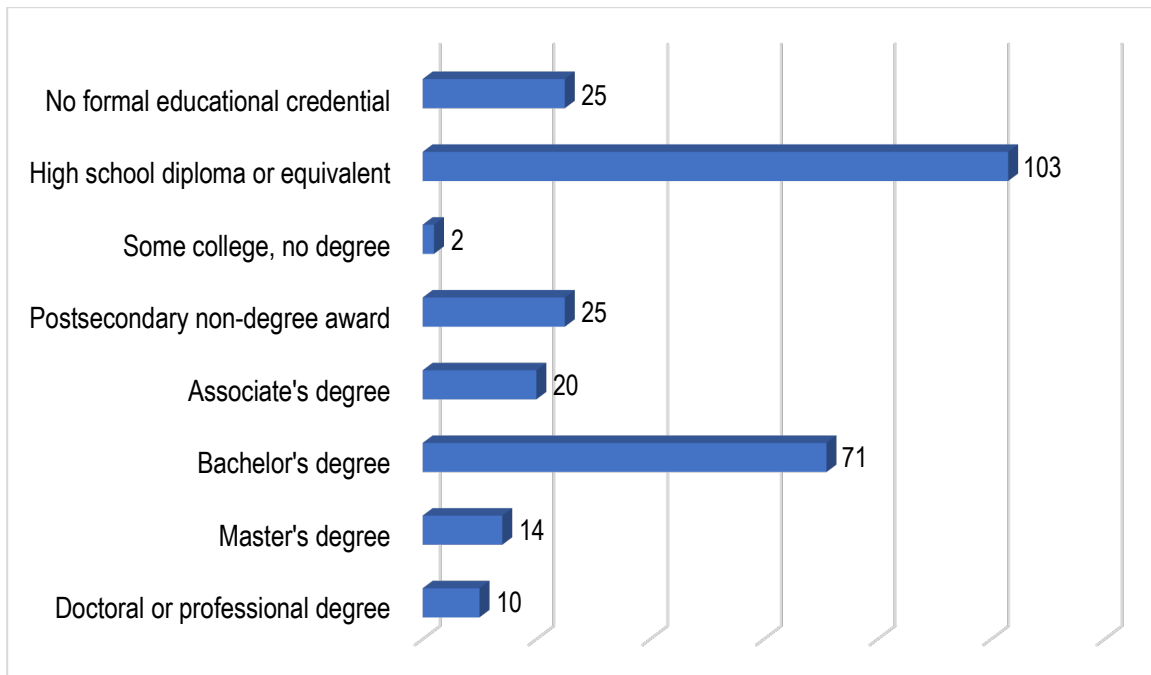

Examine, analyze, and interpret accounting records to prepare financial statements, give advice, or audit and evaluate statements prepared by others. Install or advise on systems of recording costs or other financial and budgetary data.

Education: This occupation typically requires a Bachelor's degree

OJT: Employees in these occupations usually need several years of work-related experience, on-the-job training, and/or vocational training.

Tasks: Prepare detailed reports on audit findings. Report to management about asset utilization and audit results, and recommend changes in operations and financial activities. Collect and analyze data to detect deficient controls duplicated effort, extravagance, fraud, or non-compliance with laws, regulations, and management policies. Inspect account books and accounting systems for efficiency, effectiveness, and use of accepted accounting procedures to record transactions. Supervise auditing of establishments, and determine scope of investigation required. Confer with company officials about financial and regulatory matters. Examine and evaluate financial and information systems, recommending controls to ensure system reliability and data integrity. Inspect cash on hand, notes receivable and payable, negotiable securities, and canceled checks to confirm records are accurate. Examine records and interview workers to ensure recording of transactions and compliance with law and regulations. Prepare, examine, or analyze accounting records, financial statements, or other financial reports to assess accuracy, completeness, and conformance to reporting and procedural standards. Prepare adjusting journal entries. Review accounts for discrepancies and reconcile differences. Establish tables of accounts and assign entries to proper accounts. Examine inventory to verify journal and ledger entries. Analyze business operations, trends, costs, revenues, financial commitments, and obligations to project future revenue and expenses or to provide advice.

Plan, direct, or coordinate one or more administrative services of an organization, such as records and information management, mail distribution, and other office support services.

Education: This occupation typically requires a Bachelor's degree

OJT: Employees in these occupations usually need one or two years of training involving both on-the-job experience and informal training with experienced workers. A recognized apprenticeship program may be associated with these occupations.

Tasks: Direct or coordinate the supportive services department of a business, agency, or organization. Set goals and deadlines for the department. Prepare and review operational reports and schedules to ensure accuracy and efficiency. Communicate with and provide guidance for external vendors and service providers to ensure the organization, department, or work unit's business needs are met. Develop operational standards and procedures for the work unit or department. Establish work procedures or schedules to organize the daily work of administrative staff. Learn to operate new office technologies as they are developed and implemented. Manage paper or electronic filing systems by recording information, updating paperwork, or maintaining documents, such as attendance records or correspondence. Meet with other departmental leaders to establish organizational goals, strategic plans, and objectives, as well as make decisions about personnel, resources, a space or equipment needs. Oversee payroll functions, such as maintaining timekeeping information and processing and submitting payroll. Read through contracts, regulations, and procedural guidelines to ensure comprehension and compliance. Represent work unit at meetings or conferences and serve as liaison for requests or complaints. Supervise administrative staff and provide training and orientation to new staff. Analyze internal processes and recommend and implement procedural or policy changes to improve operations, such as supply changes or the disposal of records. Acquire, distribute and store supplies.

Clean chipped area, using wire brush, and feel and observe surface to determine if it is rough or uneven. Apply hardening and sealing compounds to cure surface of concrete, and waterproof or restore surface.

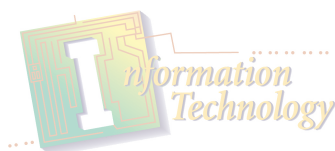

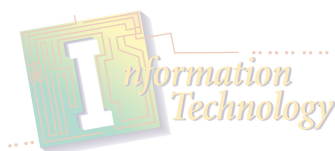

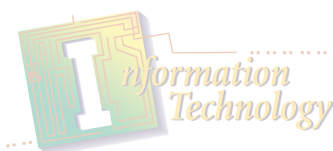

Apply lacquers and waxes to mold surfaces to facilitate assembly and removal of laminated parts. Check all dies, templates, and cutout patterns to be used in the manufacturing process to ensure that they conform to dimensional data, photographs, blueprints, samples, or customer specifications. Inspect, clean, and assemble molds before beginning work. Trim cured materials by sawing them with diamond-impregnated cutoff wheels.

Remove excess cement to clean finished surface. Disconnect and remove appliances, light fixtures, and worn floor and wall covering from floors, walls, and cabinets. Heat and soften floor covering materials to patch cracks or fit floor coverings around irregular surfaces, using blowtorch.

Turn valve controls to start equipment and to adjust operation to maintain product quality. Determine mixing sequences, based on knowledge of temperature effects and of the solubility of specific ingredients. Fill processing or cooking containers, such as kettles, rotating cookers, pressure cookers, or vats, with ingredients, by opening valves, by starting pumps or injectors, or by hand. Give directions to other worker who are assisting in the batchmaking process. Fill orders for products and samples, following order tickets, and forward or mail items. Sort products or materials into predetermined sequences or groupings for display, packing, shipping, or storage. Signal or instruct other workers to weigh, move, or check products. Store samples of finished products in labeled carton and record their location. Remove from stock products or loads not meeting quality standards, and notify supervisors or appropriate departments of discrepancies or shortages. Maintain, monitor, and clean work area such as recycling collection sites, drop boxes, counters and windows, and areas around scale houses.

Use hand-welding, flame-cutting, hand-soldering, or brazing equipment to weld or join metal components or to fill holes, indentations, or seams of fabricated metal products.

Education: This occupation typically requires a High school diploma or equivalent

OJT: Employees in these occupations need anywhere from a few months to one year of working with experienced employees. A recognized apprenticeship program may be associated with these occupations.

Tasks: Weld components in flat, vertical, or overhead positions. Operate safety equipment and use safe work habits. Examine workpieces for defects and measure workpieces with straightedges or templates to ensure conformance with specifications. Recognize, set up, and operate hand and power tools common to the welding trade, such as shielded metal arc and gas metal arc welding equipment. Weld separately or in combination, using aluminum, stainless steel, cast iron, and other alloys. Select and install torches, torch tips, filler rods, and flux, according to welding chart specifications or types and thicknesses of metals. Ignite torches or start power supplies and strike arcs by touching electrodes to metals being welded, completing electrical circuits. Connect and turn regulator valves to activate and adjust gas flow and pressure so that desired flames are obtained. Determine required equipment and welding methods, applying knowledge of metallurgy, geometry, and welding techniques. Monitor the fitting, burning, and welding processes to avoid overheating of parts or warping, shrinking, distortion, or expansion of material. Mark or tag material with proper job number, piece marks, and other identifying marks as required. Chip or grind off excess weld, slag, or spatter, using hand scrapers or power chippers, portable grinders, or arc-cutting equipment. Prepare all material surfaces to be welded, ensuring that there is no loose or thick scale, slag, rust, moisture, grease, or other foreign matter. Preheat workpieces prior to welding or bending, using torches or heating furnaces. Align and clamp workpieces together, using rules, squares, or hand tools, or position items in fixtures, jigs, or vises.

Education: This occupation typically requires a High school diploma or equivalent

OJT: Employees in these occupations need anywhere from a few months to one year of working with experienced employees. A recognized apprenticeship program may be associated with these occupations.

Tasks: Start machines, adjust controls, and make trial cuts to ensure that machinery is operating properly. Determine product specifications and materials, work methods, and machine setup requirements, according to blueprints, oral or written instructions, drawings, or work orders. Feed stock through feed mechanisms or conveyors into planing, shaping, boring, mortising, or sanding machines to produce desired components. Adjust machine tables or cutting devices and set controls on machines to produce specified cuts or operations. Monitor operation of machines and make adjustments to correct problems and ensure conformance to specifications. Set up, program, operate, or tend computerized or manual woodworking machines, such as drill presses, lathe shapers, routers, sanders, planers, or wood-nailing machines. Select knives, saws, blades, cutter heads, cams, bits, or belts, according to workpiece, machine functions, or product specifications. Examine finished workpiece for smoothness, shape, angle, depth-of-cut, or conformity to specifications and verify dimensions, visually and using hands, rules, calipers, templates, or gauges. Install and adjust blades, cutterheads, boring-bits, or sanding-belts, using hand tools and rules. Inspect and mark completed workpieces and stack them on pallets, boxes, or on conveyors so that they can be moved to the next workstation. Push or hold workpieces against, under, or through cutting, boring, or shaping mechanisms. Change alignment and adjustment of sanding, cutting, or boring machine guides to prevent defects in finished products, using hand tools. Inspect pulleys, drive belts, guards, or fences on machines to ensure that machines will operate safely. Remove and replace worn parts, bits, belts, sandpaper, or shaping tools. Secure woodstock against a guide or in a holding device, place woodstock on a conveyor, or dump woodstock in a hopper to feed woodstock into machines.
