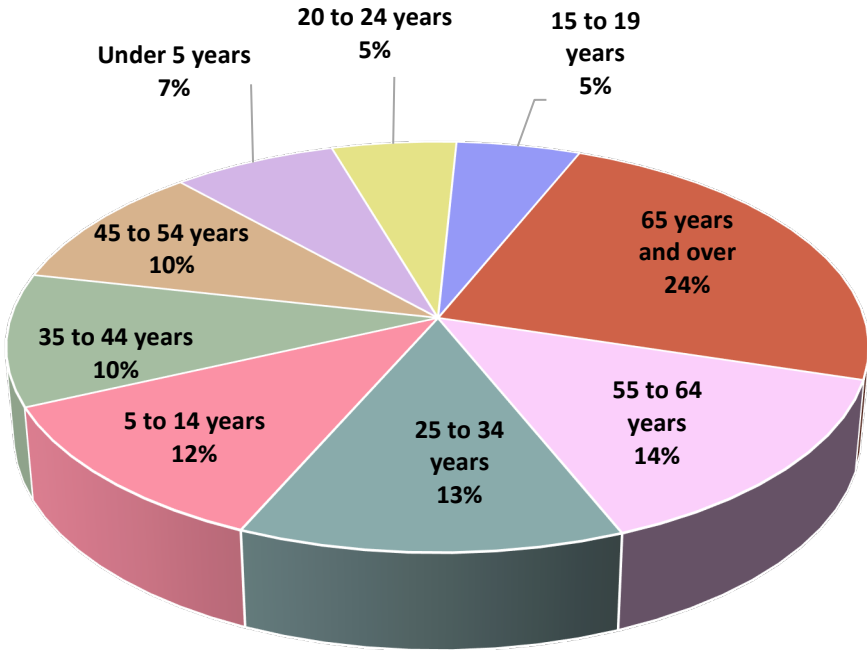

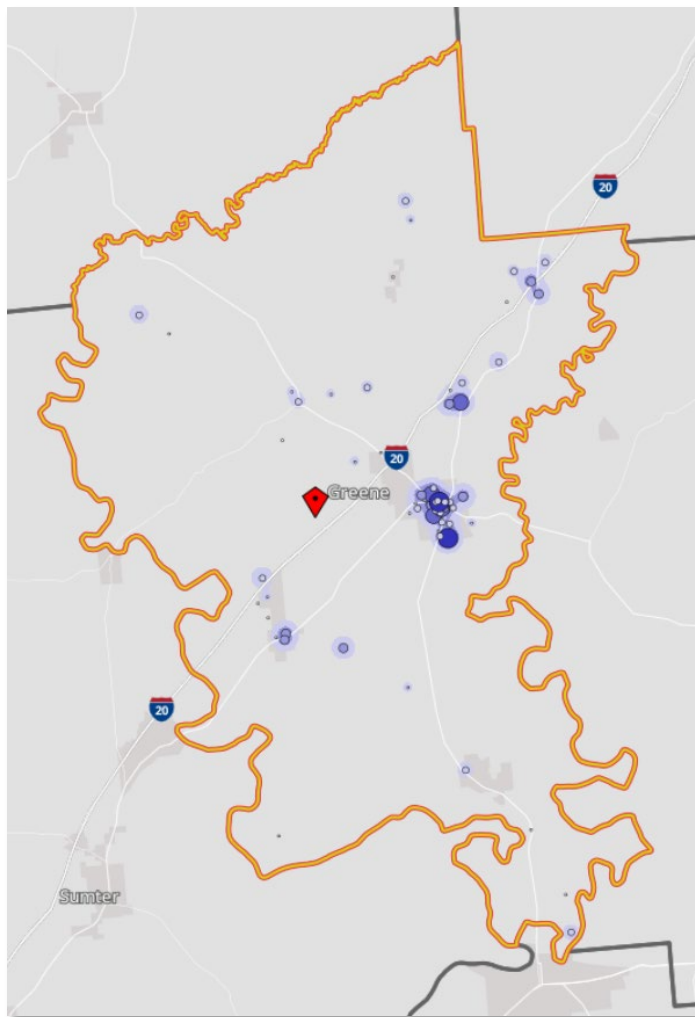

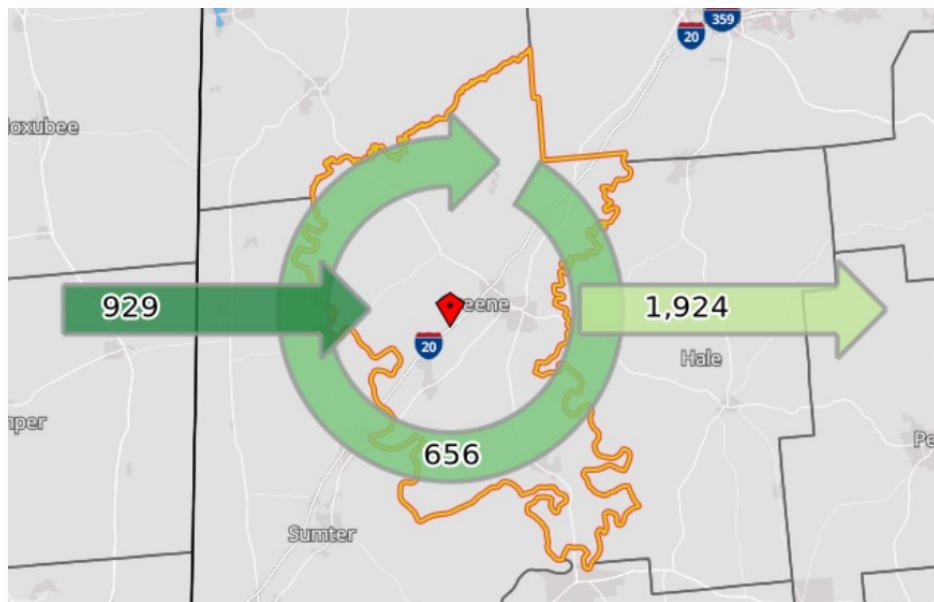

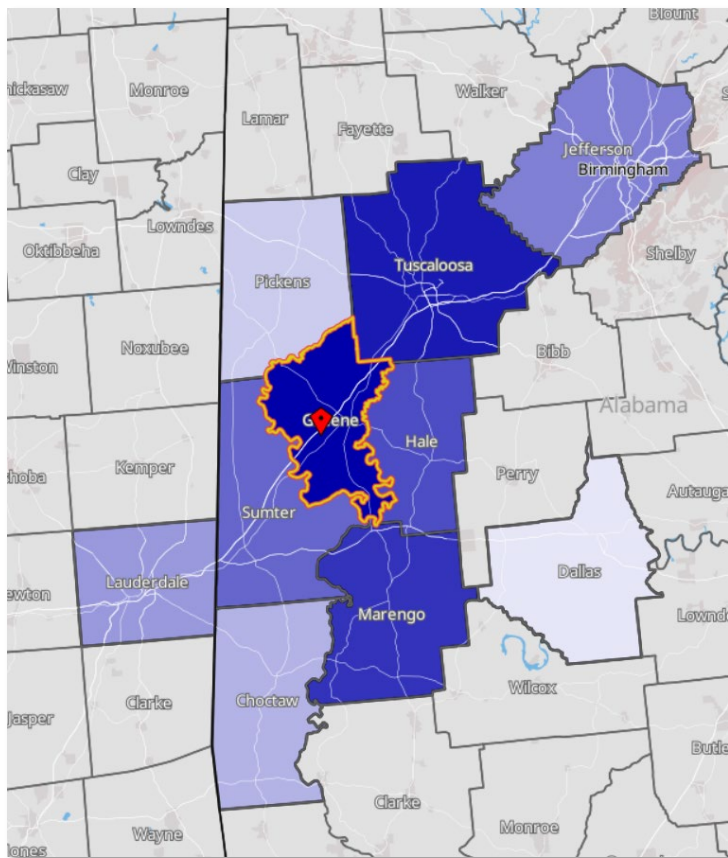

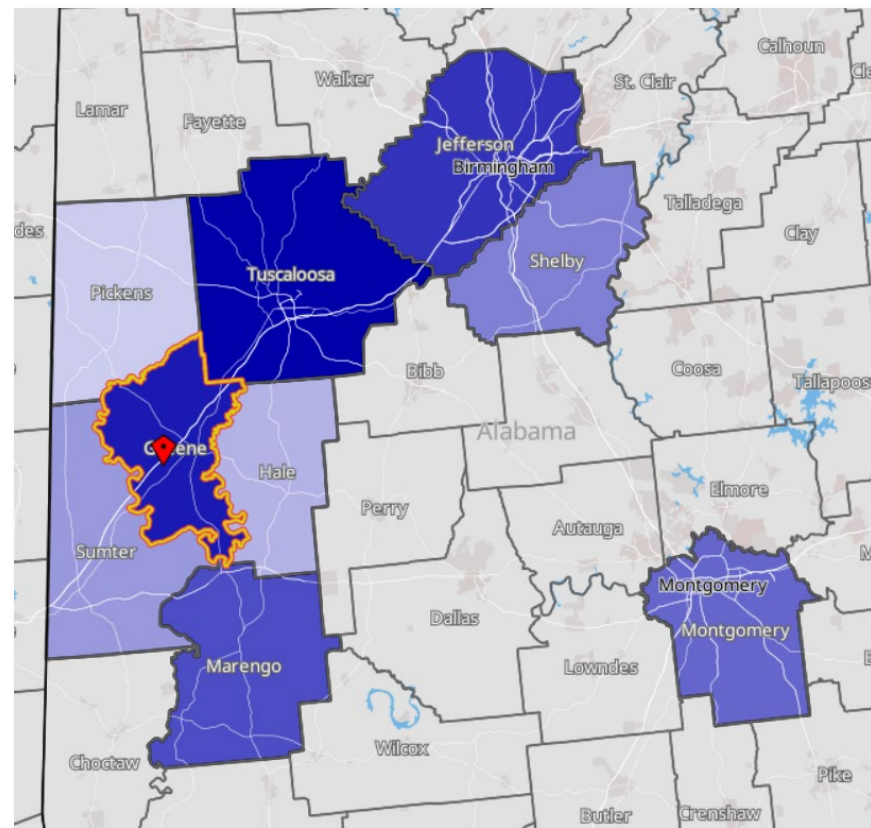

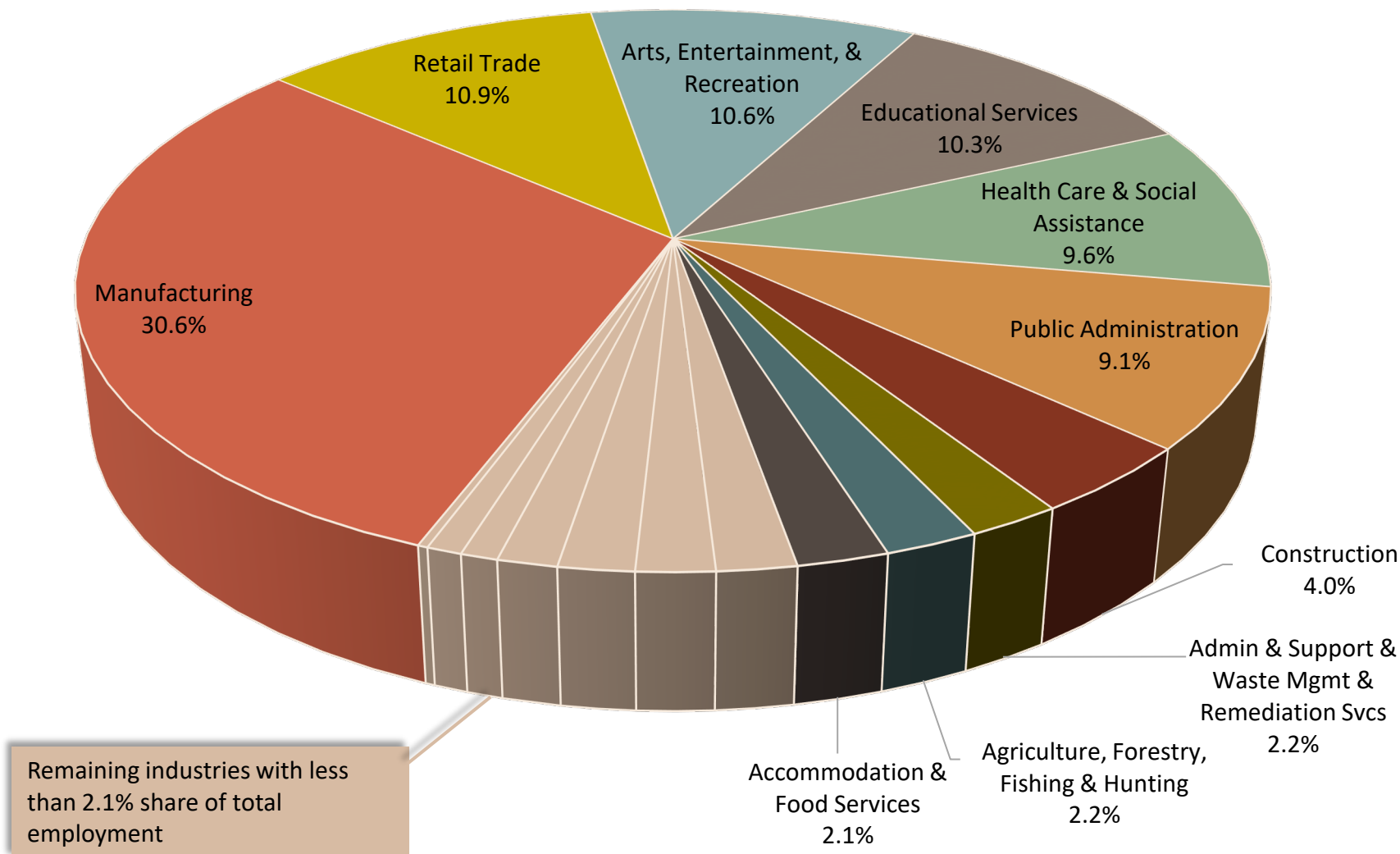

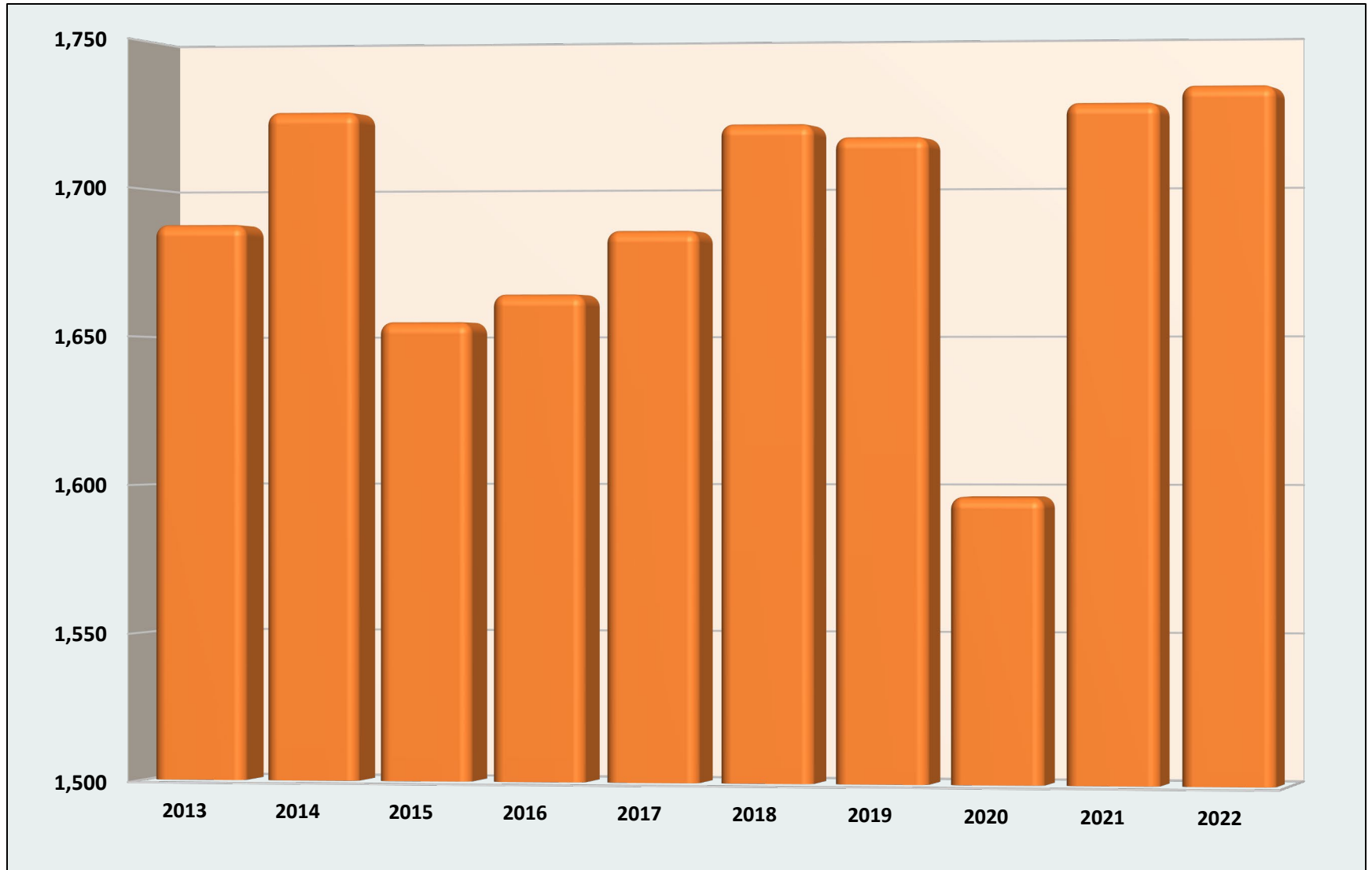

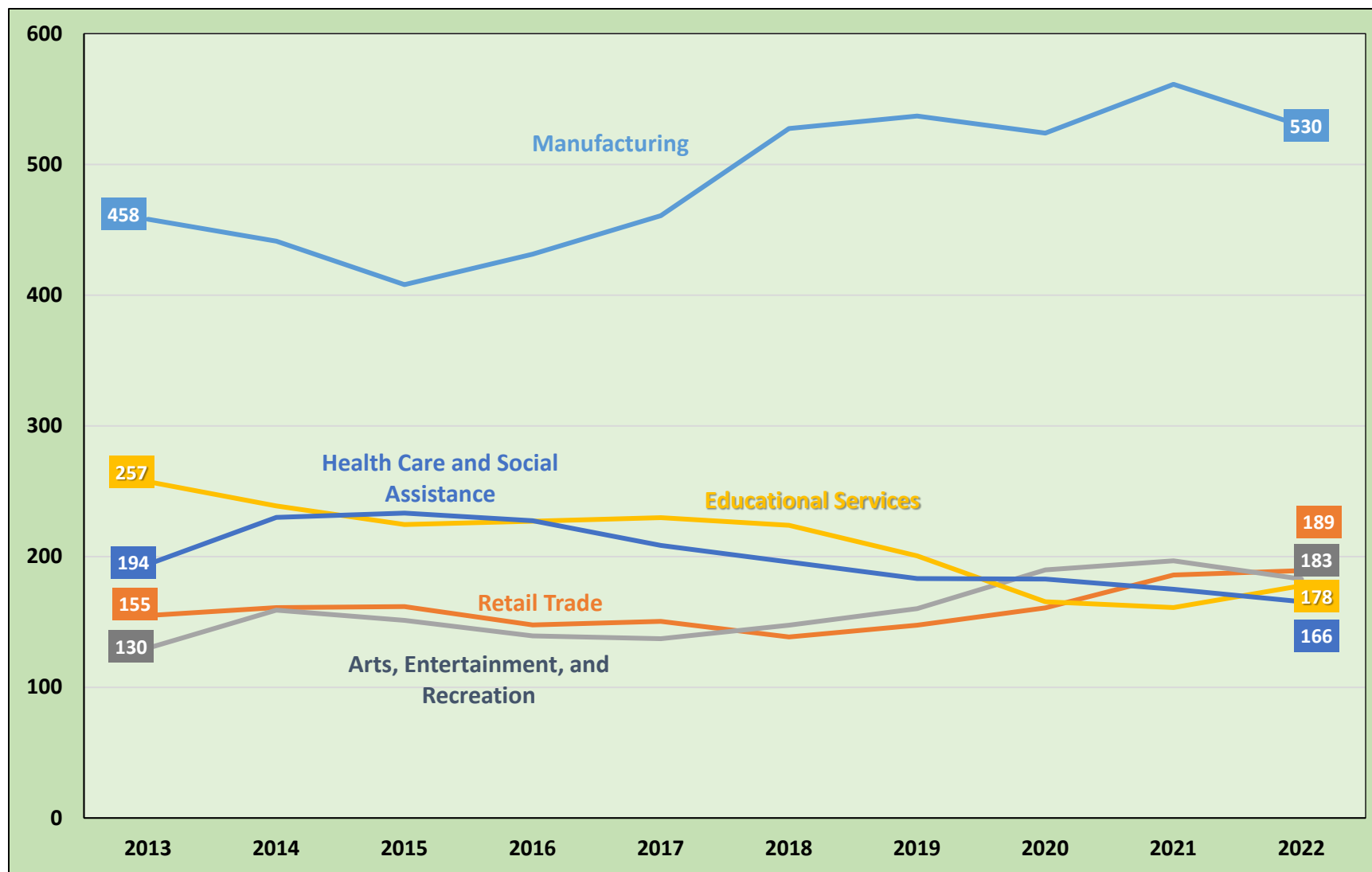
# Industry Total Employment Trend

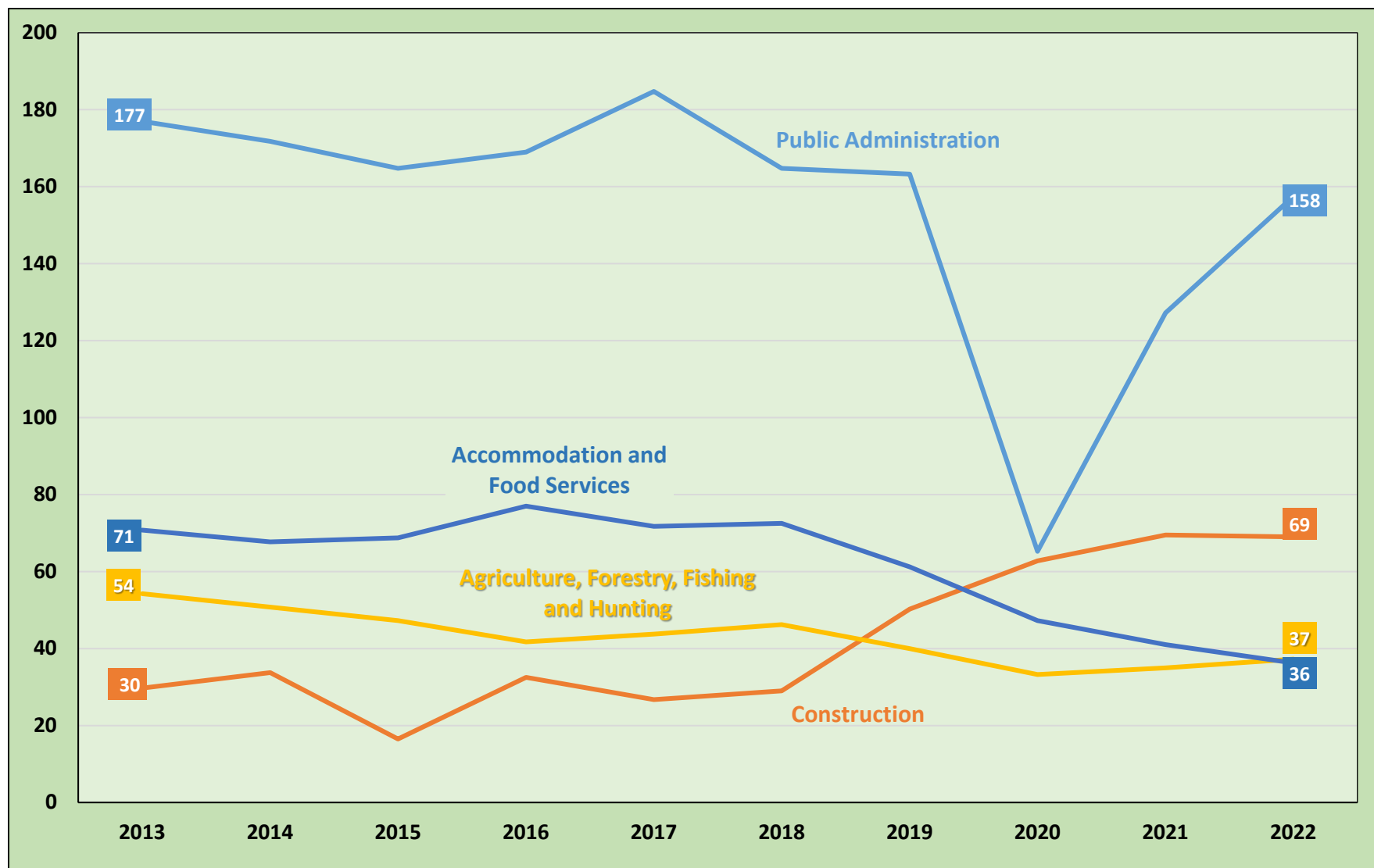


# Industry Sector Employment Trends



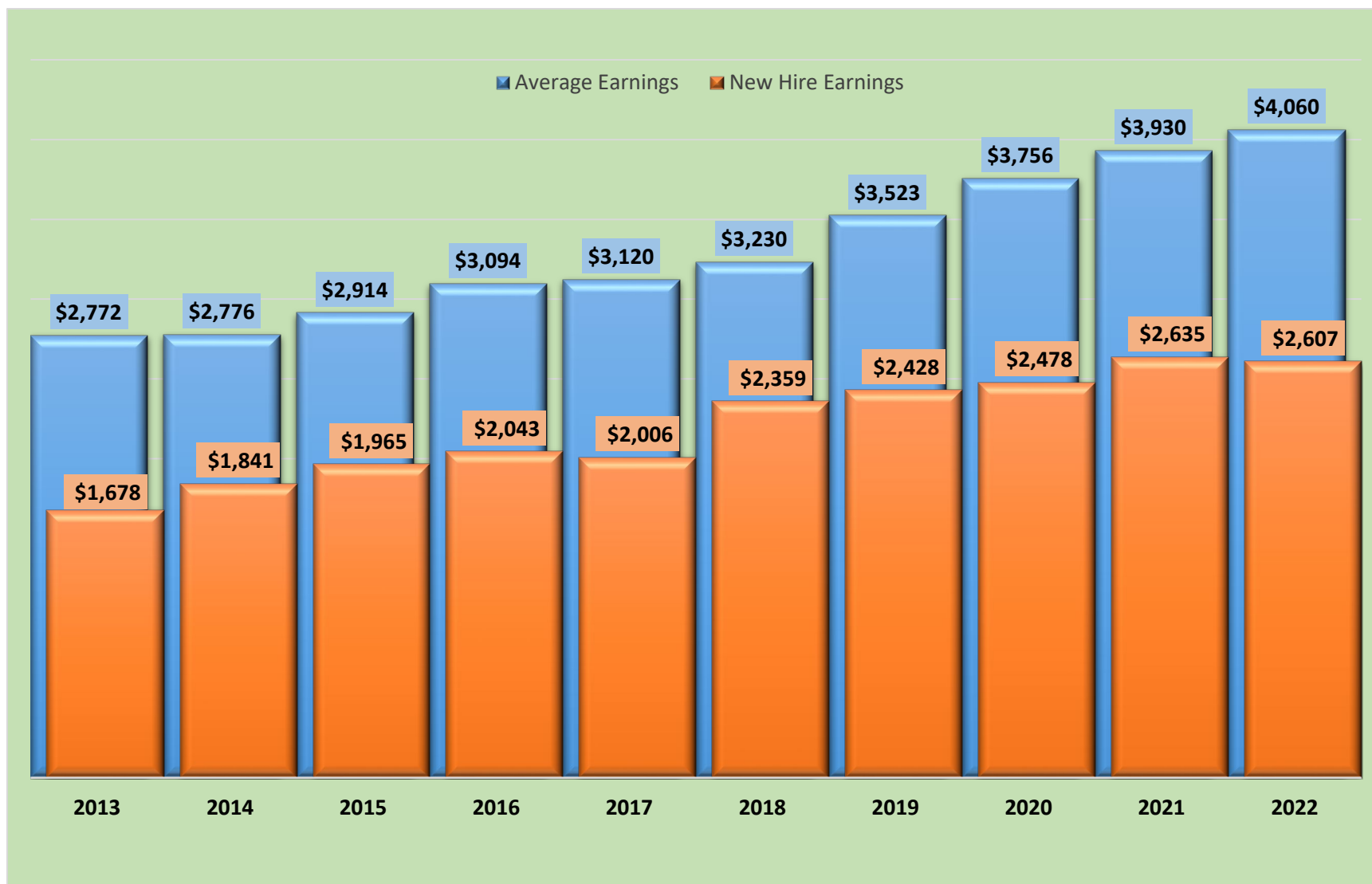
